



International student organizations host many fun events, from city visits or weekend trips to language cafés.

LEARNING GERMAN

Pre-semester Courses

Four-week, intensive German language courses for all levels of proficiency are offered before the semester starts, either during the International Summer Academy, witch takes place in August, or the International Winter Academy, witch takes place in January. In addition to the language courses, you can also sign up for excursions and seminars on German life and culture. Attending the academy is also a great way to make friends and settle in before the semester starts.



German Language and Culture Courses

During the semester, the University of Mannheim provides German courses for all levels of proficiency as well as specialized language courses on topics relating to business, culture, or politics, such as Germany Since 1870, Fit for Germany and German Art Through the Ages.




Tandem Language Partner

THE CITY OF MANNHEIM

Mannheim is a multicultural city in the state of Baden-Württemberg, and is about 70 km/ 43 miles south of Frankfurt am Main with its international airport. With a population of approximately 320,000 people, Mannheim has a city center which is small enough to explore on foot, but big enough to offer a vibrant urban culture with lots of cafés, movie theaters, cultural events, concerts, theaters and museums. The university campus is located right in the city center.

Additionally, Mannheim's central location makes a perfect starting point for discovering the rest of Germany and Europe, be it hiking in the beautiful Palatinate or taking a weekend trip to the Black Forest or even to France. There are many destinations nearby where you can take a break from the hustle and bustle of city life.
