

**PRELIMINARY LIST OF EXCHANGE PROGRAMS AVAILABLE TO MMOSCM STUDENTS FOR A SEMESTER ABROAD IN FALL 2027 OR SPRING 2028  
APPLICATION DEADLINE 15 OCTOBER 2026**

**This preliminary list** contains the exchanges available to MMOSCM students for the application round in fall 2026, deadline 15 October 2026. **The final list will be posted on 15 September 2026**, so please check the final version before you submit your application since we may add or remove programs!

Please note that **all the information given in this list is based on past experience and may be subject to change, so please keep in mind that you will need to be flexible.** Make sure to do your own research on the universities you are interested in and check their websites for information on course choice and potential requirements regarding minimum/maximum workload, the academic calendar and exam periods, and potential administrative fees (like the “Semesterbeitrag”). In addition, you should read carefully the information on a semester abroad provided by both the [Central International Office](#) and the [Business School](#).

**Please also note the following:**

- Most of our partner schools in non-English speaking countries offer business courses in English. The table below indicates the (main) language(s) of instruction. You need to submit **proof of language skills for any language(s) you want to study in. Please check the [partner school database](#) to find out which proof of language skills you will need for which exchange program. If you are proficient in both languages** and are planning to study in both languages, many partner universities would like to see a proof of language proficiency for each of them. For **overseas** universities, it is mandatory that you submit proof of both languages of instruction when applying for a study place abroad. For **Europe**, you should ideally do this as well, but formally, proof of your main language will be sufficient at the time of your study abroad application for European universities. However, many universities will ask for both proofs at a later stage during the admission process, so it is your responsibility to also have a proof for the second language at hand by this time at the latest, to ensure that you can be admitted for courses in both languages.
- **We cannot guarantee that you will be able to attend classes that will perfectly match your Mannheim curriculum** as the decision on the course offer for exchange students lies with the respective partner schools. This may affect the duration of your degree as a whole.
- In some cases, you may be enrolled in specific **programs**; at other institutions, there will be a choice of courses from different programs or from a list of courses available to exchange students. If nothing is specified in the comments column, you can assume that this will be the case. Please check the school’s website and/or the student experience reports (see partner school database) for further details.
- Please note that term dates may differ from the Mannheim **academic calendar**, and that some schools use a trimester system.
- Especially when applying for an MBA exchange you should have **practical experience** (internships etc.). If there is a minimum requirement by the partner school, it will be specified in the “comments” column. In most cases, internships and student jobs can be considered (partially if part time). If in doubt, make sure to check with your study abroad advisor at the Business School.
- Before you apply, read the [application instructions](#) very carefully and make sure your application is in line with the requirements.
