🔍 About the Fulbright Schuman Program

- Who can apply: Citizens of EU member states
- Fields of study: Open to all disciplines, with a required focus on EU affairs/policy or transatlantic relations
- Award duration: Up to 9 months
- Location: Accredited universities or research institutions in the U.S.
- Eligibility: Applicants must secure their own affiliation at a U.S. institution



Featured Award: Fulbright-NATO Security Studies Award

In partnership with the U.S. Mission to NATO, the Fulbright Commission in Brussels also invites applications for the Fulbright-NATO Security Studies Award. This opportunity supports post-doctoral researchers, university faculty, and professionals from NATO member countries to spend 3 months in the U.S. conducting research and/or lecturing on NATO-related themes, such as:

- Peace and security
- Cybersecurity
- Non-proliferation and disarmament
- Security and defense policy
- Transatlantic studies
- Military history
