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### Schedule and Deadlines

**Note:** Important dates are **emphasized**. All deadlines are at 23:55 on the specified day.

Week	Tasks and deadlines
<b>1</b> Feb 10 – Feb 16	<b>Registration and topic assignments</b> <i>Register via Portal2 until <b>Feb 10</b>. If you are accepted into the seminar, provide at least 4 topic areas of your preference (your own and/or from the <b>seminar's website</b>) by <b>Feb 16</b> via email to <b>Julie Naegelen</b>. The actual topic area assignment takes place soon afterwards; we will notify you via email. As soon as you receive your topic area, start studying the relevant literature. You will be assigned a tutor as a primary point of contact during the seminar.</i>
<b>2</b> Feb 17 – Feb 23	<b>Kick-off meeting</b> <i>The kick-off meeting will be held on <b>Feb 19, 17:15</b> (tentative).</i>
<b>3–5</b> Feb 24 – Mar 16	<b>Explore literature</b> <i>Study the relevant literature for your topic area. Propose a self-selected topic and a corresponding (starting) research paper to your tutor by <b>Mar 6</b> at the latest; we will let you know whether this topic is suitable.</i>
<b>6</b> Mar 17 – Mar 23	<b>Tutor meeting</b> <i>Meet with your assigned tutor (meetings scheduled by us via Doodle). Present a brief oral overview of your topic area and your self-selected topic (5-10 minutes). Bring at least an outline, ideally a complete draft of your flash presentation. Ask questions but do not bring your report yet.</i>
<b>7</b> Mar 24 – Mar 30	<b>Flash presentation &amp; (optional, students-only) dry run: flash presentation</b> <i>Flash presentation: Give a 3-minute flash presentation on <b>Mar 26</b> (tentative). Attendance to all presentations is required. Dry run: Optionally give a 3-minute flash presentation on <b>Mar 24</b> (tentative) to receive early feedback. Presentations during the dry run will not be graded.</i>
<b>8</b> Mar 31 – Apr 6	<b>Report submission (1<sup>st</sup> version)</b> <i>Submit your report via ILIAS by <b>Apr 6</b>. This version is not graded.</i>
<b>9</b> Apr 7 – Apr 13	<b>Peer review submission</b> <i>Read the report of your fellow student without consulting the original papers. Fill out the peer review form provided to you. The peer review is done anonymously (no one is aware who their reviewer is). Submit your feedback via ILIAS until <b>Apr 13</b>.</i>
Apr 14 – Apr 27	<b>Spring Break</b>
<b>10</b> Apr 28 – May 4	<b>Tutor meeting</b> <i>Meet with your assigned tutor (meetings scheduled by us via Doodle). Bring a draft of your final presentation and, optionally, report.</i>
<b>11</b> May 5 – May 11	<b>Dry-Run: Presentation (optional, students-only)</b> <i>Give a presentation (15+5) on <b>May 7</b> (tentative). Presentations on this day will not be graded.</i>
<b>12</b> May 12 – May 18	<b>Final Report and Final Presentation</b> <i>Hand-in your final report (as a single PDF) via ILIAS until <b>May 12th</b>. Give a presentation (15+5) on <b>May 14 &amp; 15</b>. Attendance to all presentations is required.</i>
<b>13</b> May 19 – May 25	<b>Hand-in</b> <i>Hand in all your materials (flash presentation slides, draft report (before review), review, final report, final presentation slides, each a single PDF) via ILIAS until <b>May 25</b>.</i>
