Time Period	Tasks and deadlines
1 07.09.–14.09.	Registration and topic assignments <i>Register via Portal2. If you are accepted to the seminar, provide at least 4 topics of your preference (Reference papers provided on the seminar's website) by the end of September 14 via e-mail to Margret Keuper and include Shashank Agnihotri (shashank.agnihotri@uni-mannheim.de) in cc. The actual topic assignment takes place soon afterwards. We will notify you via email. As soon as you receive your topic, start studying the relevant literature. You will also serve as a reviewer for the seminar report of another student. You will be assigned a university tutor for your presentation and report.</i>
2 15.09.–22.09.	Kick-off meeting & contact tutor <i>The kick-off meeting will be held on September 15, at 17:15. Attendance is mandatory!</i>
3 22.09.–29.09.	Explore literature <i>Study the relevant literature for your topic and understand the fundamentals of the topic.</i>
4 29.09.–5.10.	Tutor meeting <i>Meet with your assigned tutor to discuss your paper: bring an outline and give a brief oral summary of your paper for the initial meeting.</i>
5 6.10.–13.10.	Mock Flash Presentations <i>Master's Students give a Mock Flash Presentation on October 06, at 17:15 and Bachelor's students give a Mock Flash Presentation on October 13, at 17:15. Attendance is mandatory for all to both sessions!</i>
6 13.10.–19.10.	Tutor meeting <i>Meet with your assigned tutor to discuss the outcome of the Flash Presentation and finalize your Flash Presentations.</i>
7 20.10.	Flash Presentation - Master's & Bachelor's Students <i>Give a 3-minute flash presentation on October 20, at 17:15. Attendance at all talks is required!</i>
8 20.10.– 27.10.	Report submission (1st version) <i>Submit your report via ILIAS by October 27. Schedule meetings with Supervisors if you have any queries.</i>
9 28.10.–10.11.	Anonymous Peer Review submission <i>Read the report of your fellow student, shared by us, without consulting the original paper. Fill out the peer review form provided to you. The peer review is done anonymously (No one is aware of who their reviewer is.) Submit your feedback via ILIAS until November 10.</i>
10 11.11.–17.11.	Discussing the Peer Review for Master's and Bachelor's students (in parallel in different rooms) <i>Each student will now be assigned a fourth paper (different from their own paper and the two papers they peer reviewed already). They will also be provided the report written for this paper and the anonymous peer review received. They are to read the paper, the report, and the peer reviews and lead a discussion on how the report can be improved, where they believe the reviewers make valuable points, and how to address them.</i>
11 18.11.–30.11.	Tutor meeting <i>Schedule a meeting with your tutor for the week. Bring a draft of your final presentation.</i>
12 30.11. – 01.12.	Final Presentation for Master's and Bachelor's students <i>The Final Presentations (15+5) for Master's students are on November 30, at 17:15 and for Bachelor's students are on December 01, at 17:15. Attendance at all talks is mandatory!</i>
9 02.12.–23.12.	Refine your report <i>Incorporate the peer review, discussion feedback, and tutor feedback to further update your report.</i>
