Information Security 101



Common sense

- Be careful do not open attachments or links from an unknown sender
- Do not disclose passwords no one asks for your password in an e-mail, on the phone or in person
- Ignore time pressure and threats of negative consequences

Secure passwords

- At least 10 characters, uppercase and lowercase letters, numbers and symbols
- Use your password only for one service





Minimization principle

- Only install the applications you actually need
- Only set up the access rights/logins you actually need for the relevant applications
- Do not carry out daily work while being logged in on an administrator's account

Virus scanner

- Install and regularly update a virus scanner
- Regularly check your computer for viruses





Updates

Regularly update the Windows system and the applications running on it

Secure surfing

- Pay attention to the lock symbol in the address line of the browser since it indicates encrypted communication
- Never enter information on unknown websites which do not seem trustworthy and avoid to click on links on such websites





Data theft

- Lock your computer by using the keyboard combination "Windows+L" and lock your office, if possible
- Encrypt confidential data, in particular on external storage devices

Data backups

Regularly backup important data





Data destruction

- Dispose of confidential information in a confidential waste bin or destroy the information so that it cannot be restored (in accordance with DIN 66399)
- Dispose of external storage devices in the bins intended for this purpose

Security incidents

- Negative events which impair the confidentiality, availability or integrity of data
