Academic Calendar

The academic year at the University of Mannheim is divided into two semesters. The periods correspond with the **periods of official enrollment as student**:

- Fall semester: 1 August 31 January

Examination Period

The examination period takes place towards the end of the semester and runs from 3 June until 15 June 2024.

Please make sure that you are not departing from Mannheim before the exam period ends! It might happen that you write an exam on the last day of the exam period.

THE UNIVERSITY OF MANNHEIM



The City of Mannheim and its University

Studying in and around the "Schloss" (palace) and living in the "Quadrate" (squares): this is what awaits those studying in Mannheim.

The city lies at the confluence of the Rhine and Neckar rivers between Pfalz (Palatinate) and Odenwald at the borders of three "Bundesländer" (federal states): Baden-Württemberg, Rheinland-Pfalz, and Hessen. About 330,000 people live in Mannheim, and beside the university there are several technical colleges and research facilities. The historical center of the town is the Baroque "Schloss", which today makes up the largest part of the University. The symmetrical layout of the town arises from its methodical construction in the 18th century and is the source of initial confusion to strangers when they see 'L9,6', instead of a street name in addresses.

Mannheim is the modern, lively center of the Rhine-Neckar three "Bundesländer" border and is a hub for heavy industry and many medium-sized firms. Mannheim is attractive, not only for its convenient location amidst scenic countryside, picturesque and historic cities and towns. The diverse cultural scene offers something for all tastes – the National Theatre is well known outside of Mannheim, the city "Reiß-Museum" and the "Kunsthalle" have acquired a reputation in previous years for their spectacular exhibitions, and the state museum of "Technologie und Arbeit" was declared museum of the year in 1992 by UNESCO. A varied music scene, cinemas, and small theaters and many different types of sports are offered as well. Mannheim's scientific tradition dates from the 18th century with the founding of the Palatine Academy for Science at the Electoral Court. Both the bicycle and the automobile were invented in Mannheim – the first by Baron von Drais, the second by Carl Benz.



Today, around 12,000 students are enrolled in 5 Schools. Business Administration is still the most prevalent and internationally recognized field at the university, while the social sciences have acquired the esteem as the second most prominent field, and the Schools of Law and of Humanities have also developed an excellent reputation over the years.

The university has a strong international orientation with connections to 450 partner institutions throughout the world. Moreover, 18 percent of its students come from abroad. The university is also pursuing new directions in education by taking part in different programs such as the double degree schemes in business studies, for example with Bocconi in Milan (Italy), CBS in Copenhagen (Denmark), ESSEC in Paris (France), Chengchi in Taipeh (Taiwan), NHH in Bergen (Norway), Queen's in Kingston, Ontario (Canada) and USC in South Carolina (USA). The university is housed in the Schloss and a row of neighboring buildings. It is near the train station and well connected to the local public transport system (bus, tram and train).

Course Choice

You can find an overview of the courses on offer at the University of Mannheim in the <u>online course catalog</u>.

The following rules apply for your course choice:

- Bachelor / undergraduate students: Bachelor courses only (except Bachelor/ undergraduate students in their 4th year of studies)
- Master/ graduate students: Bachelor and Master courses
- At least 50% of your ECTS/credits must come from the Business School

Home university requirements should be kept in mind to guarantee that you can transfer the credits from your Mannheim courses towards your degree at home.

Course load: There is no official limit, but we recommend not taking more than 30 ECTS (credit points) per semester (full semester workload).

Exchange students coming to Mannheim need to take at least 50% of their courses from the school through which they come on exchange (i.e. Business School for our incoming exchange students). However, you can also take German language courses or one or two courses from other Schools. For taking courses at other Schools, some restrictions apply.

University-Wide Electives:

You can choose courses outside of the Business School from our list of "University-wide Electives". If you already have previous knowledge in one of the area of studies and would like to choose courses from their regular offer, you must contact the respective exchange coordinator.

Contact Hours:

Contact hours do not reflect the workload at the University of Mannheim. Our ECTS credit system does not differentiate between contact hours and independent study time. One ECTS credit equals 25 hours, which includes contact hours and independent study time. The latter is significantly higher than the contact hours and would have to be included in the total workload hours. If your home university has contact hour requirements, we kindly ask you to write us an email so that we can find a solution together.





Course Registration

At the Business School exchange students register for their courses via Portal² during the Welcome Week and the first week of classes. If a different/prior registration is necessary, it will be stated explicitly in the course catalog. Seats are allocated either randomly or on the principle of group prioritization, not on a first-come, first-served basis.

Please note that course registration procedures and deadlines vary from school to school. If you intend to take courses outside the Business School, please read the respective course descriptions carefully and follow the instructions accordingly.

Exam Registration

The exam registration procedure at the University of Mannheim probably differs from what you are used to: Here you do not only register for courses, but you need to register for all exams and assignments that you would like to take. Thereby, you confirm your participation. Registration is possible online via our Portal². Please click <u>here</u> to find stepby-step instructions. Registration might vary depending on the form of assessment! In such cases, please pay attention to what is announced in the lecture.

Additional important advice:

- Please don't miss the registration period to avoid any fees that might incur.
- You might have more than one exam on the same day (not at the same time if you register during the given period)

Exam Preparation

During our Exam Preparation Session, we will provide you with important information on how exams are structured at our university and how to prepare for them. For most of you, our exams will probably be quite different from what you are used to. Please note that attendance is mandatory for this presentation!

Transcripts of Records

Please request a verified Transcript of Records by clicking the link, Request Transcript of Records" in your <u>Mobility Online workflow</u>.

- 1. Check in Portal² whether
- all of your grades have been published,
- a course is missing,
- the course titles are correct,
- the number of ECTS is correct and
- check for any other possible corrections that might be necessary.
- 2. Fill in in the questionnaire in Mobility Online by ticking the respective box regarding your transcript.

Grading System

The grading scheme at the Business School of the University of Mannheim comprises five levels (with numerical equivalents; intermediate grades may be given):

- 1.0 = "very good"
 2.0 = "good"
 3.0 = "satisfactory"
 4.0 = "fair"
 5.0 = "failed"
- 3. You will receive an email once the Transcript has been updated and is available in Portal². Please download your transcript in the Student Services section in Portal² (My studies > Student Service > Requested Reports/Reports > Common reports) and forward it to your home institution.

Internship Application Advice

For those of you who are planning to do an internship in Germany, we provide a CV and cover letter check. You can either send them by email or book a consultation appointment with Christina Paul.

Enrollment, Re-Enrollment

Enrollment takes place at the Central International Office ("Akademisches Auslandsamt" in German). Please click on <u>this link</u> to get information about when to register, which documents to have with you, etc.

Those of you who are nominated to also spend the fall semester 2024 at the University of Mannheim have to re-enroll until 15 June by transferring the 120.30 EUR administrative fee to the University's bank account. The fee is a legal fee for every student enrolled at the university as a lot of supportive institutions are financed by the fee, such as the cafeterias or student dorms. It can not be waived or paid by any one else but the student (individually).

German Language and Culture Courses during the Semester

If you would like to improve your German language proficiency whilst you are here, you can participate in up to 3 courses for 15.- EUR per course and receive ECTS-Credits for participation. Registration for those courses is done via Portal². If you have any questions, please contact <u>germancourses@uni-mannheim.de</u>.

In addition, Studium Generale offers several other language courses (French, Italian, Spanish,..., presentation courses, computer skills courses etc. The fees per course differ depending on the type of course (language courses cost 69.- EUR per course) and registration is done <u>online</u>.

We can also help you with the online registration during the Welcome Week. Please note that you do not receive any ECTS-Credits for participation in these classes. However, they are all offered by highly qualified personnel and only available for students and staff.

LEISURE ACTIVITIES



Mannheim offers a wide selection of activities. If you like spending time outdoors and would like to enjoy the weather in one of the sunniest regions in Germany, then the beautiful city park "Luisenpark" that spreads over 420 square kilometers is the right place to go. If you need to cool off a bit you can spend the day at the Stollenwörthweiher lake that is easily accessible by tram (line 3).

The art museum "Kunsthalle" displays a wide range of contemporary and historical art, including artists such as Van Gogh or Monet. If you are fond of drama and theater be sure to pay a visit to the national theater ("Nationaltheater") and watch one of their plays. No matter if you are more into traditional opera or modern plays, you will find something for your taste.

Semester Ticket

Exchange students are eligible to buy the so called "VRN Jugendticket BW". The VRN JugendticketBW, can also be issued as a semester ticket against a one-time payment in advance at the rnv mobility centers.

The "VRN Jugendticket BW" costs around 25€/month and is purchased via a contract. The money will be deducted from your bank account monthly and lasts either 6 or 12 months. You can travel throughout the state of Baden-Württemberg and the VRN network area.

Students who are older that 27 are not eligible to purchase the "VRN Jugendticket BW", but are able to purchase a "semester ticket" instead. This ticket is only valid throughout the VRN-area, not the whole state of Baden-Württemberg.

The "semester ticket" costs 185€ for one semester and the whole amount needs to be paid in advance. You can buy it online through the rnv and DB or via the app VRN-Ticket (DB) as well as at the mobility centers / travel center.
