The **Mannheim Institute for Sustainable Energy Studies (MISES)** offers a position as a

### **Teaching Assistant (m/f/d)**

for the course „**Microeconomics for doctoral students in business**”  
(about 80 hours in total from September 2019 to December 2019).

„Microeconomics for doctoral students in business” (E 701) is a module for doctoral students in their first year at the Center for Doctoral Studies in Business (CDSB). The course is taught in English and provides an introduction to microeconomic theory on the doctoral level for PhD candidates in business. Students are mainly following the Finance, Accounting, or Taxation tracks.

#### **Your tasks:**

Preparation and organization of the tutorials, assistance with the exam grading, answers to student questions, and assistance in the student inspection of the exams. The tutorials consist of a total of 5 sessions, each of a length of 90 minutes, which are to be held at maximum once a week. You will organize your work self responsibly but cooperatively with the instructors of the lecture course: S. Reichelstein and N. Wölfig.

#### **We expect:**

- the candidate to hold a PhD or to be a doctoral student in the second or third year in business or economics.
- the successful completion of an advanced microeconomics course at the doctoral level.
- a generally strong academic record with a good knowledge of microeconomic theory.
- proficiency in English, commitment, reliability and the ability to teach in an engaging and insightful manner.
